HSE Music Powerpoint Database

If you have been to a candlelight or community gathering in the last few months, you'll notice that we are beginning to use the overhead systems to project the lyrics of the music as well as announcements and other information.

With each event, we are building a database of music which can be used at future community gatherings, candlelight services, and if you would like, during the walks

as well. (Hi-Sky Emmaus now owns a laptop and a projector which can be used when we are at locations which doesn't have this equipment available to the community.)

To keep the feds happy, we do have to make sure certain things are placed on the slides for each song. This ensures that we are using the music/lyrics legally and helps to keep the community from having any issues due to

copyright laws.

Currently, our nerd, Rhett Lively is working to add more music to the database and he will updated the website accordingly.

This time will give us time to check all the equipment, verify the database has everything you'll need, and make sure someone is available to operation the system.
