Things You Might Not Know About a Hi-Sky Walk to Emmaus Weekend...

- Welcome to the Walk to Emmaus. The first rule of Walk to Emmaus is: TALK about the Walk to Emmaus. There is nothing secret about Emmaus. Share your experience with others and answer their questions. Often, the greatest obstacle to Emmaus for someone is the image of secrecy.
- 2. Prayer is Good! Anyone from any Emmaus community is welcome to sign up for the 72-hour prayer vigil. If you would like to pray for your spouse or a friend who is giving a talk during the walk weekend, you can pray for them from your home or you are welcome to come pray in the prayer room at Circle Six.
- 3. The Upper Room is the creator and copyright holder of all Walk to Emmaus activities. Hi-Sky Emmaus and every Hi-Sky Emmaus board member has signed a covenant to follow the Upper Room guidelines.
- 4. The Lay Director is a community member who has served Emmaus in background roles (the Servant Team) and on Conference Room teams in various positions. including 2 or more times as an Assistant Lay Director. In addition, Lay Directors should be actively participating in a local church and a Reunion Group.
- Board members and Lay Directors are nominated by the Hi-Sky Emmaus Nominating Committee, which is comprised of both board members and community members at-large. Those recommended by this committee are then voted on by the Hi-Sky

- Emmaus Board. Potential board members are further elected from ballots cast by the entire Hi-Sky Emmaus community.
- 6. Any person who is active in the community is qualified to serve Hi-Sky Emmaus as a board member. The term for a board member is three years
- 7. Anyone who has attended a Chrysalis weekend (Walk to Emmaus version for 15-19 year olds) can also attend a Walk to Emmaus. The talks for each are different and the experience will also be different.
- 8. You do not have to have attended a Walk to attend a Community Gathering meeting. Invite your spouse, friends, and co-workers. The Community Gathering is an excellent way to begin to show someone the Love and Grace with which the Hi-Sky Emmaus community is built.
- 9. For 2015, all Board meetings are held on the third Tuesday of every month at 6:00 pm at Our Savior's Lutheran. The board meetings are open to community members.
- 10. All talks given during an Emmaus weekend are previewed during the team meetings which allows for practice and preparation for the Walk Weekend.
