The Hi-Sky Emmaus Community has officially been around for 28 years. Since the two of us were charter members, we have been asked to share some of the early history of the organization. Probably, most of you know that The *Walk to Emmaus*[™] is fashioned after the *Cursillo*[™] of the Catholic Church. The *Cursillo*[™] began in Spain at the end of World War II. When *Cursillo*[™] participants returned to the United States after the war, the movement became ecumenical with Protestants attending. In 1981, the Upper Room, an agency of the United Methodist Church, with the blessings of the Catholic Church, formed the *Walk to Emmaus*[™].

Early on, one of the most active areas for Emmaus[™] was around San Antonio, Texas. Word of this great 3-day event soon reached Midland. In 1985, a few people, mostly from St. Luke's UMC, attended Walks. That's when we heard about it. But, the Walks were being held in Junction or Kerrville which seemed too far to go for a 3-day retreat. Two people who did attend were Larry and Carol Crumpton of St. Luke's. This pair was to provide much of the early Lay leadership for our Community.

In 1986, Walks began being held in San Angelo which was now close enough for more people to attend. So, a number of people from Midland, including the two of us, along with a few people from Big Spring, Colorado City and various other parts of Northwest Texas, attended our Walks in San Angelo. Two couples who attended that year and who provided vital assistance in the early years of Hi-Sky were Jack and Mary Lou Abenschan and Carlton and Waldeen Thomas - both men were Methodist ministers.

After a few of us had attended Walks, we began holding monthly gatherings. The meetings were held in a small Sunday School classroom at St. Luke's UMC. At times, we sang acapella because we had no musicians. Also, there were times where we had no clergy to consecrate the communion elements. So, we used a love-feast format. But, we grew! We graduated to larger rooms and eventually to fellowship halls and sanctuaries.

In 1987, we decided we were large enough to become "official." We applied for a charter with the Upper Room, elected a Board of Directors and began planning our first two "Best Walks EVER!!" Those Walks were held in August and September, 1987 at Camp Butman, south of Merkel, Texas. We did not have enough people to completely staff the team. So, people from the Concho County Community in San Angelo helped us by providing 12 team members.

Teams were not as large in those days. Music teams consisted of 2 people: a guitar player and a song leader. There were only a few Assistant Lay Directors since there were only a few Reunion Groups in the Community to provide Agape. There was no "outside" team, no "clean-up" team, and no fancy trailer or cabinets to store supplies. Supplies were transported in the team's vehicles. The team cleaned up after the Walk was over and we usually found ourselves getting back to Midland around midnight on Sunday evening.



In spite of a few handicaps, we did have full Walks with waiting lists and the Walks were great. Prayer and the Holy Spirit continued to lead the Community. Before long, Neil Moore of Midland built the first trailer for the Walk materials and supplies, making the logistics of putting on a Walk easier.

Some of the team members and some of the pilgrims on the first set of Walks were from the Texas Panhandle. After the Walks had been completed, these people asked us to go to that area and hold two Walks. This was quite a request for a brand new Community that did not have enough people to fully provide the team members for its first Walks. So, what did we say? We said what Emmaus[™] folks always say when asked to fulfill a need..."sure, we'll do it!" So, our second set of Walks were held in Amarillo in January and February of 1988 with team meetings in Lubbock and Amarillo.



The Midland team members who attended all the team meetings, and most did, travelled about 1700 total miles for those Walks. That was quite a few "second" miles but how could we do anything else? Our own success was due in part to the help from the Concho County Community. We were aware in return, that we had a strong obligation to help other new Communities. At that time, there were no other established Emmaus[™] Communities for hundreds of miles to the East, West and North. The request for help did come in and we

responded. Some of the areas that we helped by providing team members, and in some cases Lay Directors, were Abilene, Amarillo, Big Spring, Lubbock, New Mexico, Odessa, Seymour, and Snyder.

We also helped one of our members go to South Africa to help with the first Walk there. In time, one of our participants went to Nashville and served a few years as the Director of the Worldwide Emmaus[™] movement. So, in a sense, our Community has helped in sharing the Emmaus experience all over the world. We, like the rest of you, have been richly blessed by Emmaus[™]. We still look forward to our weekly Reunion Groups. Often, we have heard new Emmaus participants ask, :when does the excitement go away?" Our answer is, "We don't know...We've only been doing it for 29 years!!"

home support, day enrichment programs, vocational services, and therapy services to West Texans with developmental disabilities. MARC empowers about 150 people with developmental disabilities with services offered in our many different programs. It operates 16 group homes, 2 vocational centers, The Marc-et (an upscale resale boutique), 2 office buildings and a park. MARC is excited to be opening Spectrum of Solutions, a new building that will house our therapy program for children with autism and behavioral needs.

Of all the things we treasure at MARC, our volunteers are at the top. There are many opportunities for people in the Hi-Sky Emmaus Community to volunteer with this organization. MARC volunteers have treated some folks to the movies, taken them out to eat, and even treated a few to a Dallas Cowboy's game. You can share your special talents with MARC clients through daily enrichment programs by teaching canvas painting, organizing a bell choir, or teaching wood working. Maybe you can teach a class in photography, how to sew, or how to use social media.

MARC also needs volunteers to help with handyman projects like painting, carpentry, vehicle maintenance and general home maintenance and there are also opportunities to volunteer with children in MARC's therapy programs though camps or social outings.
